Recognitions

In 2024 Mateusz Choróbski was awarded a prize by Luce5, an international company operating in Europe, Asia and North America, collaborating with art institutions like Fondazione Prada and artists like Ai Weiwei. The award - an exhibition at the Museo Diefenbach in Capri, accompanied by a catalogue - was preceded by the realisation of new sculptural works titled "Salty Flowers".
